SUBJECT: CONSIDER ADOPTING ORDINANCE NUMBER 2016-O-059 GRANTING A VARIATION FOR A FENCE FOR CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED AT 6801 180th COURT — SECTION XII.3.G.6. OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE — LISA CAUSLEY – **Trustee Vandenberg**

ACTION: Discussion: The Petitioner, Lisa Causley, seeks approval for a fourteen-foot (14') Variation from Section XII.3.G.6. where a six foot (6') tall privacy fence is permitted at a fifteen foot (15') setback. This Variation would allow the Petitioner to construct a new six foot (6') tall privacy fence at a one foot (1') setback from the east (Oak Park Avenue) property line at 6801 180th Court in the NG (Neighborhood General) Zoning District. SUBJECT: CONSIDER ORDINANCE NUMBER 2016-O-062, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE XI OF THE TINLEY PARK MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING AMUSEMENT TAX – **Trustee Maher**

ACTION: Discussion: The Village enacted an amusement tax in 1990. The amusement tax is primarily applicable to the live performances held at the outdoor concert venue now known as the Hollywood Casino Amphitheatre, but also applies to other live or recorded entertainment events such as plays, musicals, sporting events, and movies where an admission is charged. The tax was enacted as part of the development of the music theater venue and helped to support an inducement (incentive) agreement for the theater developers to locate the facility here versus other locations that were under consideration. The tax code contained a provision applicable to motion picture theaters that exempted a portion of the movie admission or ticket price from the amusement tax calculation. This provision had been included to address a second run movie theater that had existed at the time the tax was imposed which charged a relatively small ticket price. The theater to which this provision applied subsequently closed and thus this exemption is no longer applicable or necessary. Accordingly, this provision was recommended for removal from the Municipal Code. In reviewing this change, the opportunity was also taken to review the rate of the tax. A review the revenues and expenses associated with the 26 year old amusement tax was performed. A part of this review included a comparison to the amusement tax rates charged by other communities throughout the State. After review, it was recommended to increase the tax rate to 5%. This rate is comparable to the majority of communities with an amusement tax. It is also not the highest amusement tax rate charged. This ordinance updates the Tinley Park Municipal Code to remove the movie theater exemption and to increase the tax rate from 4% to 5%. The new rate will be effective for events occurring on or after January 1, 2017. This item was discussed at a Finance and Economic Development Committee meeting held on November 1, 2016 and recommended for approval. This Ordinance is eligible for first reading.

SUBJECT: CONSIDER ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH PSC GROUP, LLC FOR EXPANSION OF THE VILLAGE’S SHAREPOINT PROGRAM – **Trustee Suggs**

ACTION: Discussion: The proposed contract with PSC Group, LLC is for expansion of the Village’s SharePoint software/program. Expansion of the program will allow for increased ability for the Village to organize, track and manage projects and data. Current area municipalities that utilize SharePoint include, but is not limited to, the following: Village of Glenview; City of St. Charles and City of Naperville. Experience and cost information from five (5) qualified firms was obtained by the Village. Open review of the qualifications and cost, staff is recommending that the Village enter into an agreement with PSC Group based on a number of factors, including, but not limited to:

1. **Relevant and Prior Experience** – Tinley Park has worked with PSC in the past and found their service to be of excellent quality;
2. **Cost** – PSC provided the Village with the lowest proposal; and
3. **Location** – PSC is located in Schaumburg, IL, which is more beneficial to the Village than an out of state vendor.

This item was discussed at the November 8, 2016 Budget & Administration Committee and recommended for approval. Funds for this project are budgeted and available in the current fiscal year budget. Consider entering into an agreement with PSC Group, LLC for expansion of the Village’s SharePoint Program.

Proclamation In Recognition of Ed Paesel For Outstanding and Dedicated Service

- WHEREAS,** Ed Paesel began his tenure as only the second Executive Director of the South Suburban Mayors and Managers Association in May 2000. Prior to becoming the Executive Director with SSMMA, Ed's home community of Sauk Village elected him into public office for 16 years, the last 12 as Mayor, all of which provided him a solid familiarity on the scope of issues facing elected officials and local governments; and
- WHEREAS,** during his tenure with SSMMA, Ed Paesel was appointed to a multitude of posts including, among others, the METRA Board of Directors, the Access to Care Board of Directors, the Cook County Workforce Investment Board and the Land Use Committee for the Chicago Metropolitan Agency on Planning; and

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A VARIATION FOR A FENCE FOR CERTAIN
PROPERTY LOCATED AT 6801 180th COURT – SECTION XII.3.G.6. OF THE
ZONING ORDINANCE – LISA CAUSLEY

WHEREAS, a Petition for granting a Variation, as set forth below, has been filed with the Village Clerk of this Village and has been referred to the Plan Commission of this Village and has been processed in accordance with the Tinley Park Zoning Ordinance, as amended, and;

WHEREAS, said Plan Commission held a workshop for the Variation request on October 6, 2016, followed by a public hearing on the question of whether the requested Variation should be granted on October 20, 2016, at the Village Hall of this Village, at which time all persons present were afforded an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has filed its report of findings and recommendations regarding the Variation with this Village President and Board of Trustees, and this Board of Trustees has duly considered said report and findings and recommendations; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Tinley Park, Cook and Will Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: That this President and Board of Trustees, after considering the report and findings and recommendations of the Plan Commission and other matters properly before it, finds as follows:

- (a) That the Petitioner, Lisa Causley, is the owner of the property under consideration (the "Subject Property"), legally described as follows:

LOT 1 IN BRIANNE'S RESUBDIVISION OF LOTS 5 AND 6 IN BLOCK 5, AND ALSO THAT PART OF WEST 180TH STREET, LYING SOUTH OF THE SOUTH LINE OF LOT 6 IN BLOCK 5, NORTH OF THE NORTH LINE OF LOT 1 IN BLOCK 6, EAST OF THE WEST LINE OF SAID LOT 6 IN BLOCK 5, EXTENDED SOUTH AND EWEST OF THE EAST LINE OF SAID LOT 6 IN BLOCK 5, EXTENDED SOUTH, ALL IN ELMORE'S HARLEM AVENUE ESTATES, BEING A SUBDIVISION IN THE WEST ½ OF SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 36 NORTH, RANGE 13 EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

Commonly Known as: 6801 West 180TH Court, Tinley Park, Illinois.

- (b) That Petitioner has requested a fourteen foot (14') Front Yard Setback Variation to allow the Petitioner to construct a new six-foot (6') tall privacy fence at a one-foot (1') setback from the east (Oak Park Avenue) property line at 6801 W. 180th Court in the NG (Neighborhood General) Zoning District. The proposed fence would be in the same location as the previous fence;
- (c) That the Plan Commission voted by a margin of 4 to 1 in favor of recommending to the Village Board that the Variation requested by Petitioner be granted;
- (d) That the property in question cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only under the conditions allowed by the regulations in the district in which it is located because the private use and reasonable return of the Petitioner's property is significantly reduced if permitted to only be used under the conditions allowed by the required setback for a privacy fence. The fenced portion of the yard would be reduced by fourteen feet (14') in width.
- (e) That the plight of owner is due to unique circumstances in that the property is adjacent to a highly trafficked road, Oak Park Avenue, and there are few other properties along Oak Park Avenue that present similar circumstances.
- (f) That the granting of the Variation will not alter the essential character of the locality because a fence previously existed in this location. In addition, there is a larger than normal parkway adjacent to Oak Park Avenue (about 28') in this area, which provides additional distance between the fence and the street at this time.
- (g) That the Petitioner has provided evidence establishing that she has met the standards for Variations contained in Section X.G.4 of the Zoning Ordinance.

Section 2: That a fourteen foot (14') Front Yard Setback Variation from Section XII.3.G.6. of the Zoning Ordinance to allow the Petitioner to construct a new six-foot (6') tall privacy fence at a one-foot (1') setback from the east (Oak Park Avenue) property line at 6801 W. 180th Court in the NG (Neighborhood General) Zoning District, is hereby granted.

SUMMARY OF VARIATION REQUEST

The Petitioner, Lisa Causley, is requesting a fourteen-foot (14') Variation from Section XII.3.G.6. of the Zoning Ordinance where a six foot (6') tall privacy fence is permitted at a fifteen foot (15') setback. This Variation would allow the Petitioner to construct a new six-foot (6') tall wood privacy fence at a one-foot (1') setback from the east (Oak Park Avenue) property line at 6801 180th Court in the NG (Neighborhood General) Zoning District. The proposed fence would be in the same location as the previous fence.

UPDATES FROM THE 10/6/2016 STAFF REPORT ARE IN RED

BACKGROUND

The subject property is located in the Neighborhood General District in the Legacy District. The Petitioner, Lisa Causley, wishes to replace the six-foot (6') tall wood privacy fence that was recently taken down with a new six-foot (6') tall wood privacy fence. The Petitioner has stated that the fence is necessary to provide safety for the property and keep pets within the yard. The Petitioner has already staked out the locations for posts for the proposed fence. During a discussion following the 10/6 Plan Commission meeting, the Petitioner stated that they would be open to using a different fence material, such as PVC.

The previous fence was permitted to the Petitioner in 1998. The Petitioner stated that portions of the previous fence were damaged by snow removal in the adjacent parking lot. Additionally, the Petitioner noted that a windstorm earlier this year caused part of the fence to blow over. The Petitioner's request for a Variation would allow a similar six-foot (6') tall wood privacy fence at the same location as the previous fence.

VILLAGE STAFF COMMENTS

Staff has reviewed the petition for a Variation from the required setback for fence. It is important for the Plan Commission to note that fences for properties within the Village's Legacy District must adhere to the fence regulations of the Legacy Code (Section XII.3.G. of the Zoning Ordinance) which takes precedence over the fence regulations in other sections of the Zoning Ordinance (Section III and Section V). Additionally, Variations from the Legacy Code are required to come before the Plan Commission rather than the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Staff notes that the property is part of a residential cul-de-sac and the Petitioner's property is adjacent to Oak Park Avenue on the east, Vet Tech Institute on the south, another single-family dwelling on the west, and 180th Court on the north. This is the only single-family dwelling within this cul-de-sac development that is zoned NG and is part of the Legacy District. It is typical for the Legacy District to encompass parcels directly adjacent to Oak Park Avenue.



Section XII.3.G.6. of the Zoning Ordinance (Legacy Code, Fencing) states that the following fences are permitted for private frontages:

1. Extending to Property Lines: Fence 3' to 4' tall maximum and open-style/decorative
2. Extending No Closer Than 15' to Property Line of Secondary Frontage: Fence 6' tall maximum

Since the Petitioner has a pool in the rear yard, the Petitioner is unable to install a fence lower than five feet (5') in height since the Building Code requires a minimum fence height of five feet (5') for lots with pools. Staff inquired if the Petitioner would opt to install a separate fence around the top of the pool, but since the pool is positioned within the deck, the Petitioner stated that it would not be ideal to construct a fence within the deck area to surround the pool and further the Petitioner is seeking greater privacy, security and buffering from the adjacent commercial uses and traffic along Oak Park Avenue.

While the Petitioner could meet the second locational standard (shown as a green line on the Variation Request Diagram), the Petitioner stated that it would be a major drawback to not be able to fence the east portion of their yard. The Petitioner stated that they have been able to fence the east portion of their yard for the last twenty years and losing space on the east side of their property would be detrimental to the enjoyment of their property.

Staff also notes that 180th Street connects to Oak Park Avenue just across the street from the Petitioner’s rear yard. Without a privacy fence, headlight glare from the vehicles at the 180th Street stop sign infiltrate the Petitioner’s rear yard.

EXISTING FRONT YARD FENCES

Staff found that the next nearest single-family dwelling on a corner lot is 6801 179th Place also has a fence (chain-link), along the east (Oak Park Avenue) property line.

Staff will provide further analysis of other single-family dwellings on corner lots within the Legacy District at the 10/20 Plan Commission meeting.

CONSIDERATIONS

The Plan Commission should consider the following factors when making a determination about fence locations on corner lots:

1. Was a fence in existence at the same location on this property?
2. Is the fence adjacent to a major thoroughfare?
3. Is the fence impacting safety of pedestrians, bicycles, vehicles, etc.?
4. Does the fence alter the character of the area?

STANDARDS FOR GRANTING A VARIATION

Per Section X.G.4. and Section XII.5.H. of the Zoning Ordinance, the Plan Commission shall not recommend a Variation from the regulations of the Zoning Ordinance unless it shall have made Findings of Fact, based upon the evidence presented for each of the Standards for Variations listed below. Staff has provided draft findings below in red.

- 1. The property in question cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only under the conditions allowed by the regulations in the district in which it is located.**
 - The private use and reasonable return of the Petitioner's property is significantly reduced if permitted to only be used under the conditions allowed by the required setbacks. The fenced portion of the yard would be reduced by fourteen feet (14') in width.
- 2. The plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances.**
 - The plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances in that the property is adjacent to a highly trafficked road (Oak Park Avenue) and there are few other properties along Oak Park Avenue that present similar circumstances.
- 3. The Variation, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality.**
 - If the Variation were granted, it will not alter the essential character of the locality because a fence previously existed in this location. In addition, there is a larger than normal parkway adjacent to Oak Park Avenue (about 28') in this area, which provides additional distance between the fence and the street at this time.
- 4. Additionally, the Plan Commission shall also, in making its determination whether there are practical difficulties or particular hardships, take into consideration the extent to which the following facts favorable to the Petitioner have been established by the evidence:**
 - a. The particular physical surroundings, shape, or topographical condition of the specific property involved would result in a particular hardship upon the owner, as distinguished from a mere inconvenience, if the strict letter of the regulations were carried out;
 - b. The conditions upon which the petition for a Variation is based would not be applicable, generally, to other property within the same zoning classification;
 - c. The purpose of the Variation is not based exclusively upon a desire to make more money out of the property;
 - d. The alleged difficulty or hardship has not been created by the owner of the property, or by a previous owner;
 - e. The granting of the Variation will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood in which the property is located; and
 - f. The proposed Variation will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to an adjacent property, or substantially increase the congestion in the public streets, or increase the danger of fire, or endanger the public safety, or substantially diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood.

APPROPRIATE MOTION

If the Plan Commission wishes to make a motion, the following motion is **written in the affirmative** for the Commission's consideration:

"...make a motion to consider recommending that the Village Board grant the Petitioner, Lisa Causley, a fourteen-foot (14') Variation from Section XII.3.G.6. of the Zoning Ordinance where a six foot (6') tall privacy fence is permitted at a fifteen foot (15') setback. This Variation would allow the Petitioner to construct a new six-foot (6') tall wood privacy fence at a one-foot (1') setback from the east (Oak Park Avenue) property line at 6801 180th Court in the NG (Neighborhood General) Zoning District. The proposed fence would be in the same location as the previous fence."

The proposed fence would be in the same location as the previous fence.

MS. KISLER explained the specifics for the Petitioner's request for a Variation. Pictures and diagrams were presented of the property. MS. KISLER clarified that the reason this request was being brought before the Plan Commission versus the Zoning Board is that the property is located in the Legacy District and has a separate set of regulations, known as the Legacy Code, and per the Legacy Code the Plan Commission reviews the Variation request. MS. KISLER explained some topics the Plan Commission should consider when discussing this request:

1. Was a fence in existence at the same location on this property?
2. Is the fence adjacent to a major thoroughfare?
3. Is the fence impacting safety of pedestrians, bicycles, vehicles, etc.?
4. Does the fence alter the character of the area?

MS. KISLER noted that this is a workshop for discussion purposes and there will be a Public Hearing on October 20, 2016 where a vote for a recommendation can be made.

ACTING CHAIRMAN MOYLAN asked the Commissioners if there were any questions.

COMMISSIONER JANOWSKI asked if there were any neighbors of this property in this audience. MS. KISLER explained that a notice went out to the surrounding property owners regarding the upcoming Public Hearing as well as in the newspaper and no one was expected this evening but people may attend the Public Hearing.

COMMISSIONER SHAW asked if this particular property is a unique situation of itself or if there could be future requests of the same type that should be considered for uniformity. PAULA WALLRICH, Interim Community Development Director, stated that for the Public Hearing it would be advantageous to have the information shared on similar sites to see if a precedent would be set by granting the Petitioner's request.

COMMISSIONER BERGTHOLD raised the issue of the existing landscaping and future landscaping possibilities in regard to aesthetics.

ACTING CHAIRMAN MOYLAN asked if the Petitioners were responsible for the fence along the south end of the property. JEFF LYON, property owner, stated that they maintain the fence but it has consistently been damaged during their twenty (20) year occupancy due to snow plowing for the parking lot to the north..

COMMISSIONER KRONER brought attention to a petition that the Petitioners had signed. Property owners surrounding the property signed the petition to allow the requested fence Variation.

ACTING CHAIRMAN MOYLAN asked if the Petitioners had any questions or comments to add. LISA CAUSLEY, property owner, stated that MS. KISLER explained the situation thoroughly. She reiterated various information as well as stating that they do not want to lose a large portion of their useable property due to not being granted the Variance.

COMMISSIONER JANOWSKI recommended that the adjacent commercial property should put up a bumper rail adjacent to the fence to avoid damage in the future.

COMMISSIONER KRONER asked if the Petitioners would be open to the idea of planting in the parkway. MS. WALLRICH stated that the parkway is not the Petitioner's property and that any planting in the parkway would be the responsibility of the Village.

COMMISSIONER SHAW wanted clarification on the Zoning requirements in 1998 when the fence was originally put in to today's requirements. MS. KISLER stated that there was a building permit for the fence but no record of a Variance.

ACTING CHAIRMAN SHAW explained the protocol to the public of how the meeting will run.

ACTING CHAIRMAN SHAW requested anyone present in the audience who wished to give testimony, comment, engage in cross-examination or ask questions during the Hearing stand and be sworn in.

A motion was made by COMMISSIONER BERGTHOLD, seconded by COMMISSIONER KAPPEL to open the Public Hearing. THE MOTION WAS APPROVED by voice call. ACTING CHAIRMAN SHAW declared the Motion approved.

ACTING CHAIRMAN SHAW confirmed receipt of the Notice and Certificate of Publication posted in the Daily Southtown on October 2, 2016 per State requirements and stated that notifications were sent to surrounding property owners per Village protocol.

ACTING CHAIRMAN SHAW requested that Staff give their presentation.

STEPHANIE KISLER, Planner I, provided an overview of the Petitioner's request for a Variation to allow a privacy fence within the required front yard setback. She also presented diagrams representing the Petitioner's property as well as similar properties within the Legacy District. MS. KISLER stated that in discussions with the Petitioner, they are willing to consider a PVC material versus wood to address any aesthetic concerns of the Village of Tinley Park.

MS. KISLER summarized the Findings of Fact as follows:

1. The private use and reasonable return of the Petitioner's property is significantly reduced if permitted to only be used under the conditions allowed by the required setbacks. The fenced portion of the yard would be reduced by fourteen feet (14') in width.
2. The plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances in that the property is adjacent to a highly trafficked road (Oak Park Avenue) and there are few other properties along Oak Park Avenue that present similar circumstances.
3. If the Variation were granted, it will not alter the essential character of the locality because a fence previously existed in this location. In addition, there is a larger than normal parkway adjacent to Oak Park Avenue (about 28') in this area, which provides additional distance between the fence and the street at this time.

ACTING CHAIRMAN SHAW asked the Commissioners if they had any questions for Staff. There were none. ACTING CHAIRMAN SHAW asked the Petitioner(s) if they would like to make a presentation at this time.

JEFF LYON, 6801 180th Court, stated that they would use the PVC material for the fencing on their property but would like to use wood fencing on the back of the property adjacent to the commercial parking lot.

ACTING COMMISSIONER SHAW asked for any other Public Comment.

COLETTE OLSON and ART OLSON stated their concerns of permitting the Variance for the Petitioner's fence. They stated that due to Village Codes be upheld they were unable to make changes to their property under these Codes. They stated that various changes to the property were not permitted and they were unable to make those same changes. They also stated that the fencing along the commercial parking lot was not damaged due to snow removal rather that the Petitioners would take that fence out when they needed to get things into their yard. Lastly, they put in a pool and there are electrical wires above.

MS. WALLRICH redirected by explaining the process of this Public Hearing and that specific Standards must be met and that the Variance is the topic of discussion.

MAUREEN BRACKA stated that the Variance should be granted to the Petitioner. She felt there were necessary reasons for this Variance such as more space for their pets. She also stated that she did not see

electrical wires above their pool. Lastly, she witnessed the damage to the Petitioners' fencing due to snow removal.

A motion was made by COMMISSIONER STANTON, seconded by COMMISSIONER KAPPEL to close the Public Hearing. THE MOTION WAS APPROVED by voice call. ACTING CHAIRMAN SHAW declared the Motion approved.

ACTING COMMISSIONER SHAW asked if there were any questions for Staff from the Commissioners at this time. COMMISSIONER BERGTHOLD inquired about the specifications of the old permit that was pulled for the original fencing on the Petitioner's property. MS. KISLER stated that the location was approved by a permit in 1998; however, there is no record of a Variation for the location of the fence. PAULA WALLRICH, Interim Community Development Director, also explained that the older permits and paperwork stating "Variance" are honored, but going forward all Variation requests will follow current protocol and will be documented better. COMMISSIONER STANTON confirmed that the Petitioner would talk to the current owner of the commercial property adjacent to the south about reimbursement for the fencing along the parking lot since damage was allegedly caused by snow removal within their parking lot.

There being no further questions or comments, with no other additions to the Findings of Fact as published and incorporating those Findings into the record, a Motion was made by COMMISSIONER STANTON to recommend that the Village Board grant the Petitioner, Lisa Causley, a fourteen-foot (14') Variation from Section XII.3.G.6. of the Zoning Ordinance where a six foot (6') tall privacy fence is permitted at a fifteen foot (15') setback and adopt Findings of Fact submitted by the Applicant and Findings of Fact proposed by Village Staff and the Plan Commission at this meeting. This Variation would allow the Petitioner to construct a new six-foot (6') tall privacy fence at a one-foot (1') setback from the east (Oak Park Avenue) property line at 6801 180th Court in the NG (Neighborhood General) Zoning District. The proposed fence would be in the same location as the previous fence. The Petitioners have agreed to replace the wooden fence with PVC material. They will also work with Vet Tech for a reimbursement arrangement for the fencing along the commercial parking lot.

The Motion was seconded by COMMISSIONER KRONER.



ORDINANCE NUMBER 2016-O-062

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE XI
OF THE TINLEY PARK
MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING
AMUSEMENT TAX**

WHEREAS, the Village of Tinley Park imposed an amusement tax in 1990; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Tinley Park finds it prudent to periodically review the rates and charges to assure that adequate funds are produced and available to support governmental operations and maintenance activities; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Tinley Park is a home rule municipality.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Tinley Park, Cook and Will Counties, Illinois, the following:

SECTION ONE

That the title of Chapter 125 be hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 125: MUNICIPAL TAXES

SECTION TWO

That the existing language of §125.026 of Chapter 125, Title XI of the General Municipal Code of the Village of Tinley Park (hereinafter "Village") be hereby amended to read as follows:

§125.026 TAX IMPOSED.

- (A) A tax is hereby levied and imposed upon all amusements within the Village at the rate of 5% of the purchase price of a ticket of admission for each person entering the premises of a place of amusement for the purpose of witnessing, viewing or participating in the amusement. The tax herein levied shall be in addition to any and all other taxes.
- (B) The ultimate incidence of and liability for payment of said tax shall be borne by the ticket user or purchaser.
- (C) The tax hereby levied and imposed shall not apply to or be imposed upon the purchase price of tickets for those persons witnessing, viewing or participating in any amusement, the proceeds of which inure exclusively to the benefit of religious, charitable or educational institutions or organizations, or not-for-profit entities duly qualified under the laws of this state.
- (D) The tax rate of 5% shall be effective for all amusements occurring on or after January 1, 2017.
- (E) The tax rate of 4% shall remain in effect for all amusements occurring through December 31, 2016

SECTION THREE

All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict.

SECTION FOUR

That the Village Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption, approval, and publication as required by law.

RE: Amusement Tax - Amendment of Municipal Code

DATE: 26 August 2016

It is suggested that we consider a change to our Municipal Code in relation to Amusement Tax. Section 125.026 of Chapter 125, Title XI currently reads as follows:

§ 125.026 TAX IMPOSED.

(A) A tax is hereby levied and imposed upon all amusements within the village at the rate of 4% of the purchase price of a ticket of admission for each person entering the premises of a place of amusement for the purpose of witnessing, viewing or participating in the amusement. The tax herein levied shall be in addition to any and all other taxes. Provided, however, that said tax shall not apply to or be imposed upon the receipts of motion picture shows where the admission fees do not exceed \$.90 per single admission; and in the case of motion picture shows, where, in whole or in part, the admission fees exceed \$.90 per single admission, said tax shall apply to and be imposed upon that portion of the receipts in excess of \$.90 per single admission derived from admission fees in excess of \$.90. The exemption provided herein shall apply only to motion-picture theaters which exhibit motion pictures exclusively.

The suggested revision would read:

§ 125.026 TAX IMPOSED.

(A) A tax is hereby levied and imposed upon all amusements within the village at the rate of 4% of the purchase price of a ticket of admission for each person entering the premises of a place of amusement for the purpose of witnessing, viewing or participating in the amusement. The tax herein levied shall be in addition to any and all other taxes.

As you may recall, the Amusement Tax was imposed in 1990 primarily in relation to the development of the outdoor music theater now known as the Hollywood Casino Amphitheatre. The Village's Amusement Tax ordinance was largely modeled on the City of Chicago, which also had a similar exemption at that time applicable to movie theaters. The provision that exempts the first 90 cents of an admission ticket for "motion picture shows" from taxation had been included in our Tinley Park ordinance to appease the operator of the Bremen Theater which was then operating a low priced "second run" movie house. The movie theater exemption has been since eliminated from the Chicago amusement tax. The Chicago amusement tax has further been amended and expanded to include a number of other "amusement" activities.

As you know, we currently do not have any "motion picture theaters" operating in Tinley Park, rendering this provision redundant and unnecessary. Additionally, if we were to get a movie theater in the future, it would be very unlikely to be a low priced "second run" theater where this exemption could have continued relevance. As you may know, a number of "boutique" and other movie theater operators have been looking for sites in the region, including Tinley Park. It would be recommended that we eliminate this exemption.

The Village's Amusement Tax has remained unchanged since it was enacted 26 years ago. Amending the Code to remove this exemption would also provide an opportunity to review the rate of the tax as well. While it would not recommend mirroring what Chicago has done in expanding the application of the tax, their current rate is 9% for all amusements except live theater in a venue accommodating 750 or more patrons where the rate is 5%. It is believed that a rate of 5% or 6% would be competitive in the marketplace and is supported by the survey attached.

If the rate were to be changed, that would also be reflected in the amended text of Section 125.026 (A). It would be suggested that a rate change should become effective after the close of the current outdoor theater season which is scheduled to be completed on September 17, 2016. An effective date of October 1, 2016 at the earliest, or the beginning of the calendar year (January 1, 2017) would be recommended.

A search and survey of amusement taxes within the State of Illinois was conducted and a summary accompanies this memo for reference purposes. Because there is no centralized reporting of amusement taxes, we do not believe that this is likely to be an all encompassing list, but it is the most comprehensive listing we are presently aware of. One of the attached lists is presented in alphabetical order by governmental entity. The second listing is in descending value order and separates the per ticket (per person) fees from the percentage based fees. Of the 37 county and municipal amusement taxes identified, 10 (27%) are at 3%; 5 (13.5%) are at 4%. The most prevalent rate of 5% is found in 12 (32%) of the locales listed.

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-O-060

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III, CHAPTER 34 OF THE TINLEY PARK VILLAGE CODE BY REPEALING SECTIONS 6 AND 7 AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 6 ESTABLISHING THE POSITION OF FIRE CHIEF

WHEREAS, Section 6(a) of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that any municipality which has a population of more than 25,000 is a home rule unit, and the Village of Tinley Park, Cook and Will Counties, Illinois, with a population in excess of 25,000 is, therefore, a home rule unit and, pursuant to the provisions of said Section 6(a) of Article VII, may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including, but not limited to, the power to tax and to incur debt; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees believe, and hereby declare, that it is in the best interests of the Village to repeal and remove the positions of Fire Prevention Administrator and Fire Marshall and establish the position of Fire Chief, set and set forth the duties and manner of appointment of said office;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Tinley Park, Cook and Will Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: Section 34.06 of the Village of Tinley Park Code is hereby repealed and removed in its entirety.

Section 2: Section 34.07 of the Village of Tinley Park Code is hereby repealed and removed in its entirety.

Section 3: The Village of Tinley Park establishes the position of Fire Chief.

Section 4: A new Chapter 34.06 shall be and is hereby added to Title III of the Village

Code, which Chapter 34.06 shall hereafter be and read as follows:

(A) There is established the office of Fire Chief of the Village. The Fire Chief shall be appointed by the President with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees, and shall be subject to removal by the Village President in accordance with ILCS Ch. 65, Act 5 § 3.1-35-10 or other applicable law.

(B) The Fire Chief shall be the chief executive and commanding officer of the Fire Department of the Village and he or she shall have the duties of: control and management of the Fire Department equipment and personnel; overseeing Fire Suppression and Fire Prevention within the Village; and financial management of the department.

(C) The salary of the Fire Chief shall be as set from time to time by legislative authority. Such salary may, at the Board's discretion, be in excess of the salary the appointed Chief may be receiving as a civil service employee of the village, and the Board shall not be obligated to restrict the payment to the amount paid the individual as a permanent civil service appointee. The Chief shall be entitled, however, to only one salary and shall be entitled to accept either the salary established for Chief or his civil service payment.

Section 3: Any policy, resolution, or ordinance of the Village of Tinley Park that conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval.

Section 5: The Village Clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.
